<u>Ethos Values</u> - As a school we have a core set of ethos values. These values underpin all the behaviour amongst children and adults alike, across the school. <u>Maths at Marlborough</u> - As a school we make use of the Mastering Number programme which aims to secure firm foundations in the development of good number sense for all children from

Reception through to Year 1 and Year 2. The aim over time is that children will leave KS1 with fluency in calculation and a confidence and flexibility with number. Attention will be given to key knowledge and understanding needed in Reception classes, and progression through KS1 to support success in the future. If your child is in Willows or Maple class please do ask them about their learning.

We also use White Rose maths as part of our curriculum for all children. The White Rose scheme uses a small step approach so that the children become confident and competent in their use of mathematics. If you go to our website you can see exactly what your children are learning.
