The Big Pedal April 18th – 29th 2016

The Big Pedal Event is taking place again this year. Schools across the country take part to compete for some amazing prizes. Last year we came 2nd in Plymouth and won a visit from a professional stunt BMX rider, who did a show for the children. The children are invited to come to school using 'bikes', 'scooters etc. If they come on wheels they will be counted. Every day the total number of children who come to school on 'wheels' will be added up and entered into the national competition. Parents can get involved too. If you come on your bike with your child you will be counted and add to our daily total. Children are allowed to come on skates or skate boards, as long as they wear suitable protective clothing and you feel that they are competent using them, however they will need to bring along their school shoes to change into before the start of school.

The event takes place over the next 2 weeks. Let's hope we can do even better than we did last year!
